Librarian Putnam informs me that you can make for us photographic prints of the U. S. Constitution MS. of which the plates are in the custody of the Library.

We desire to display the entire facsimiles on the wall in frames, therefore we should like to have the MS. as large as possible, or at any rate not reduced from the original. Also as the display is to be permanent, we should like to have special pains taken to use chemicals that are least likely to fade. I do not think of any other matters to specify. You will doubtless be the best judge, knowing the purpose for which it is to be used.

Kindly let me know when we can expect to receive the prints. There is no hurry on our part.
